Preparing for Camp

At Cedar Brook, our campers have a unique opportunity to master skills they already possess and challenge themselves in new areas of interest. This is why our program is so wide and varied. It is our hope that with each session summer campers attend, they discover more about themselves and realize their potential.



By working with our campers in small groups, our trained teachers and specialists ensure that every camper makes progress in each of our program areas. In addition to the program, each camper is a member of a small group of like-age campers that functions as a team/family throughout their time at Camp. Together, this group eats, competes, participates in special events, and goes through the social ups and downs that all groups and individuals encounter. Supervised by Counselors and a Unit Leader, it is our goal for your child to become a vital, contributing member of their group as they mature through the summer into a strong group of friends. This feeling of mutual support helps solidify lessons learned in sportsmanship, sharing and responsibility. It also forges bonds of friendship that can last a lifetime. **Learning to co-exist with others helps a child develop greater empathy, resilience, tolerance and coping skills.**

We know that children learn a lot from their parents and teachers. **At Camp, children learn from their counselors as well.** Kids often behave differently when their parents aren't around. They reach out for friendship and security, and find it in ways they never did before. Although they are authority figures, counselors also function as campers' peers. They are closer in age than parents, have a lot more energy, and can be especially playful. Our staff are trained to set positive examples, and support campers in every way!

A few words about "FUN"!

Fun is a result of the many things that happen at Camp! While camp is mostly about having fun, there are moments of Camp life-**some of the most important developmental moments that a child can have- that are simply not fun.** Such as learning to understand people's differences, dealing with challenging situations, coming to terms with your fears, not getting what you want exactly when you want it- each of these experiences while not fun, represents "teachable moments" on the important road of growth and development.

Anxiety about starting Camp (for NEW campers)

In most situations, parents have more anxiety than their kids. Children are accustomed to new situations, but as loving parents, it is natural to be concerned and question, "Will they be OK on their own? Will Camp do the little things? Will they get lost?" These are all normal thoughts, but Fortunately, you chose a terrific Camp! We will take great care of your child by treating them like our very own.

After the first couple of days, it should be smooth sailing!

Drop Off and Pick Up

Drop Off

For a full day of camp, the recommended drop off time is between 8:30AM-9:00AM, camp activities begin at 9:00AM.

Pick Up

Recommended pick up time is between 4:00PM-4:30PM. Camp activities end at 4:00PM. *There is a 15minute grace period that ends at 4:45PM, however if your child is not picked up by this time, there will be a late pick-up fee of \$10.

*If you wish to pick up your child early from camp, please let us know **THAT MORNING**

Before Care and After Care

If you would like to drop your child off earlier than 8:45AM or pick them up later than 4:30pm, we offer extended hours.

There is an additional fee for After Care and Before Care.

Additional Fee per camper for extended hours (7AM-9AM and/or 4:30PM-6:30PM): \$25 for Before care and \$25 for After care **per week.**

Special Package

- We also offer Before and After care as a package for \$40 a week.
- Before care campers may be dropped off at camp between 7:00am – 8:30AM
- After care campers may be picked up between 4:45PM – 6:30PM

*Staff will be present to supervise the campers.

HUB/Door-To-Door Bus Transportation

HUB/Door-to-door air conditioned van service is available within our service area, **(throughout Somerset and Middlesex County. Please note that not all of Middlesex County will be covered)**. Every driver has a New Jersey commercial drivers license (CDL), and a Cedar Brook staff member will also be on every vehicle to ensure safety. This staff member, is referred to as a bus counselor. They will greet you every morning and afternoon while picking up and dropping off your child. The additional fee for door-to-door transportation is \$50 per child per week, as follows;

Disciplinary Procedures

Every camper at Cedar Brook should feel physically and emotionally safe. Fighting, cursing, bullying, verbal intimidation, or any inappropriate behaviors are NEVER tolerated at camp, on a camp bus, or a trip.

A safe and friendly atmosphere is the responsibility of everyone at Cedar Brook. We strive to teach healthy, positive patterns of behavior through a learning environment that motivates individuals toward such behavior. Campers are instructed on what behaviors are acceptable and what behaviors are not.

It is our philosophy to teach campers to take responsibility for their own actions. We want campers to be able to manage their behavior, in order to succeed in daily activities.

3 Strike Policy

1st offense

Verbal Warning (depending on the severity, several warnings may be given)

2nd offense


A meeting with the counselor, camp coordinator, and Camp Director to discuss the behavior. Parents will be notified. The behavior will be documented (This may occur immediately without warnings for serious infractions.)

3rd offense

If a disciplinary problem cannot be resolved, or if a camper has recurring issues, the Camp will request a meeting with parents, and campers may be suspended. If a camper cannot change his/her negative behavior, or if it is no longer in the best interests of the camper (or other campers) for a child to remain in Camp, the camper will be removed from Camp. The suspension will be in effect the first day following the offense. Upon return from a suspension, if behavior continues, the Camp Director may permanently suspend the camper.

“Zero Tolerance to Bullying & Violence Policy”

IF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING OCCURS, IMMEDIATE DISCIPLINARY ACTION IS TO BE TAKEN PLACE AND WILL RESULT IN AN IMMEDIATE SUSPENSION AND POSSIBLE DISMISSAL FROM THE PROGRAM.



- Physical Violence
- Any form of harassment towards another camper
- Threatening (Physical or Verbal)
- Profanity
- Vandalism
- Theft
- Possession of a weapon
- Possession of drugs



Camp Checklist

Here is a list of things every camper will need to be prepared for camp

- Water (2 bottles recommended)**
Please mark your child's first and last name, or initials on their water bottle(s)

- Sun screen / Sun block / Bug spray**
Please apply sunscreen to your child before arrival at camp, and pack in a marked zip-lock bag for re-application throughout the day

- Sneakers**
Sneakers / closed toe shoes are mandatory. Flip flops and water shoes are permitted only on swim days at swim time.

- Lunch**
Pack in a lunch bag/box, disposable utensils and napkins recommended. Lunch may also be purchased online, through your parent account. Disposable lunch on trip days when applicable (Parents will be notified in advance).

- Snacks**
Campers are welcome to bring their own snacks, or purchase snack from the Snack Shack (open from 9am-4pm)

- Aquatics**
Swimsuit, towel, goggles, swim cap and other swimming necessities for swim days. Extra change of clothing (Particularly youngercampers)



Freedom of Choice Elective program

CAMPERS ENTERING 1st THROUGH 9th GRADE CUSTOMIZE THEIR DAYS!

Each Monday, campers (Grades 1-9) receive an elective sheet listing the activities offered the NEXT week. They bring the elective sheet home (also posted online, and link Emailed to you), to discuss with their parents, and submit their choices through the "Forms & Documents" section of your CampMinder account (you must first log in).

Grades 1-2 Select 1 elective / week
Grades 3-4 Select 2 electives / week
Grades 5-6 Select 3 electives / week
Grades 7-9 Select 4 electives / week



ELECTIVE CHOICES MUST BE UPDATED ONLINE EACH WEEK BY WEDNESDAY NIGHT*

Campers create an elective "Top 5" list prior to the start of the Summer (you can do it today), with choices listed in order of preference thus; the TOP CHOICE is the most desired choice, which we schedule first and then work down the list.

Any "bumped" choices (due to scheduling conflicts, closed out, or lack of attendance), are given priority placement the next week the activity is offered and chosen. Our state-of-the-art, proprietary software program ensures top picks and happy campers! Activity Preferences do not get erased from the system, so if updates are not made each week, campers may receive the same choices. Curriculum for most activities changes each week, so please be sure to update.

Please keep in mind, there is a chance that your child's choices maybe unavailable during a specific time or full. If this happens, the Camp Minder scheduling system will choose a similar elective based on your child's type of choices.

- Activities run 45 minutes per day, for one week (5 days) at a time, unless campers are scheduled to attend a trip or special event.
- Curriculum changes each week, so Campers can "Repeat" their choices.
- Read your Elective Sheets & make adjustments every week!
- If you are not attending Week 1 (6/26), your first elective sheet will be posted and a hyperlink emailed to you 9 days prior to your start date, plus a friendly reminder encouraging you to update your choices.
- Pioneers enjoy a new schedule each week that is specifically designed to include a variety of athletic, art, nature, cooking and waterfront activities, with plenty of playground time and developmental games.

Health and Safety

Here at Cedar Brook Day Camp your child's safety is the MOST important thing to us! There is only one way in, and one way out of Camp. It is guarded from 7 AM to 7 PM by experienced security guards who take their job very seriously. All staff members wear uniform shirts every day. Our adult staff is professionally background checked, and our student staff are mostly former campers who are diligently reference checked. Staff training includes professional speakers with topics including positive discipline, emergency procedures, child abuse awareness and basic medical care. We run unannounced emergency drills throughout the Camp season, we have a Registered Nurse on staff, No staff is allowed to be alone with a camper, under any circumstance, and it is grounds for dismissal.



In conjunction with the State, County and Township Offices of Emergency Management, we try to prepare for any situation. Please know that communication with our parents is an integral part of this plan, via email.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP?



1. Make sure that your Emergency Contact information and email is updated in CampMinder.
2. Make sure that people other than you or your spouse, are listed as "Emergency Contacts, especially authorized adults who could be picking up your camper(s) from Camp.
3. Remember that we are taking care of over several hundred at a time, and that we are looking out for the safety of them all. Hence, there may be a lot of people calling our phone lines if you try to contact us in the midst of an emergency (or even a severe rain storm).

Year-Round Camp Communication



Cedar Brook Day Camp utilizes the technology of “CampMinder” the leader in web-based camp database systems. When you “login” to CampMinder, you are actually IN OUR DATABASE SYSTEM! If you haven’t already, we urge you to go online ASAP to add to/update your family’s info, add/update your camper(s) health history information (an annual state requirement) and acquaint yourself to this great, state of the art communication tool.

Here’s a quick rundown of some web-based benefits:

Update your family’s information any time

Cell phone #, email, mailing addresses, etc. All reviewable online.

Forms & Documents

The “Forms & Documents” section of your CampMinder dashboard is the hub for all forms needed.

Health History

Input your information ONE TIME- and it will be with us forever! (must be updated each year- by June 1) If you haven’t done this already, please do it ASAP, as legally we need a current health history for your child to attend Camp.

Elective “Top 5 List”

Online elective selection makes choosing activities quick & easy! Go to “Forms & Documents” on your CampMinder Dashboard. Enter your “Top 5” elective choices! Electives are posted 9 days prior, and processed Thursday morning.

Payments

Put your credit card into our CampMinder system to process payments. A monthly payment option, from September through April, allows us to automatically bill your card on the 1st of each month in equal payments. Don’t forget to update your expiration dates!

Statements, Invoices and Receipts

Login now and print your statements yourself Tax ID is listed on every statement.

Financial Facts



Tuition Payments

After June 26, any outstanding balance will result in the adjustment of enrolled weeks based on the money that has been paid up to that point. Remaining weeks are filled in by any campers on our waiting list. Call us ASAP with any questions about this. When adding weeks after June 26, full payment is required immediately.

Staff Tipping and Gratuities

Every summer, we receive calls from our parents asking about tipping. Whether it's \$20, \$50, a gift certificate, or simply a heartfelt letter- staff appreciate any token of appreciation for their hard work and effort. Tips are usually given out on the Camper's last day of Camp, and are held by the office until the end of the day to distribute for the staff. If you would like to tip a staff member at any other time during the camp season please coordinate with our front office.

Cedar Brook Day Camp No-Risk Refund/Credit Policy

Here at Cedar Brook Day Camp we offer a flexible credit policy.

If a Camper cannot attend for a full week of Camp, AND the Camp is notified Monday of the week prior. In other words- Call us (better than Email) by Monday (one week in advance) about not coming the next week, you will receive a credit that can be used for upcoming weeks in the future.

“There are no refunds for missed days for any reason.”

In other words, if your child is sick, or does not attend Camp for any reason, Camp has reserved that week for you, paid for food, materials, staffing, etc.

Very Important Information

HEALTH & MEDICATION

In order to attend Cedar Brook Day Camp, all Campers must have a completed Online Health History filled out EVER SEASON, as per the NJ State Health Department. We have a Registered Nurses on staff who will treat the campers and administer medication. All medication sent in its original container! Please make sure that the Camp knows of any medications that your camper(s) may take, at home and camp, or injuries. We will call you immediately for any illness or injury at Camp.

SUNSCREEN

We highly recommend that you apply sunscreen to your camper(s) prior to their arrival at Camp. If you pack sunscreen, we will help apply the sunscreen to all Pioneer and Adventurer campers after each swim period.

EVENING EVENTS

Every summer, the Explorers (entering grades 5-6) have a Late Stay Pizza Party, and remain in Camp unless parents contact us to put them on the PM bus. Juniors are picked up at 5:30 PM (no camp bus home at that time). August 4 is our annual Family Night from 5:30-8pm, including a phenomenal BBQ dinner, Camp Musical performance, 5 & 10 Year Ceremonies, and more. Week 8, the Senior & Teen Divisions will have an Evening Dance Party in which campers will go home, return to Camp at 6 PM, and get picked up at 9 PM. There is also a 10th Grade LIT off-site Camping overnight, as well as onsite Girls Campout, and Boys Campout for Survival Skills campers grades 3-9.

COMMUNICATION

“If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the office.” We say this often, and we truly mean it. Be sure to regularly check your Email Inbox, for important updates on Camp happenings. We prohibit communication between campers and staff via texting, Emails, etc. So while staff and campers may become friendly members of groups, we feel strongly in protecting your children that they should NOT become official internet “friends”, and we prohibit our staff as such. Please monitor your children!

SNACKS

We have a “Snack Shack” open all camp hours, and there are a variety of snacks for campers to select from for purchase! (prices range from \$0.25-\$2.50)

PROHIBITED

Flip-Flops are dangerous & only permitted during Swim Periods.

Illegal substances (we reserve the right to check belongings), or anything that can be used as a weapon are strictly prohibited. Campers found to have any of these items will be immediately dismissed from Camp, with the appropriate authorities notified.

LEAVE YOUR VALUABLES HOME

The Camp will not be responsible for any lost/stolen personal items brought to Camp. We will not replace these items if they go missing for any reason. These items are unnecessary at Camp. Trading/Playing Cards are allowed only during set elective times.

*** Cell Phones, DS, iPods, and all other electronic devices are NOT ALLOWED at Camp ***

Camp is a “step back in time”, a place where we make real friends, not Facebook friends. A place where we actually speak to one another, and where games are played on fields, OUTSIDE. As useful as modern technology can be, Camp provides a break from the screens which we stare at, and an opportunity for us to interact with each other Face to Face. Kids will have plenty of time in their life to stare at screens. It's our job to give them as much sunshine as we can during their most formative years of life.
